**369. Apologies for absence**

Apologies for absence were received, recorded and accepted from Councillor Roe.

**370. Declarations of interest**

There were no declarations of interest.

**371. Matters referred from Parish Council**

Following detailed discussion Members agreed unanimously that they would be in favour of a 20mph speed limit zone through the centre of Abbots Langley. Members believe that 30mph is not a realistic or safe speed for vehicles to travel along the High Street and, due to the potential hazards along the route, a 20mph zone could be proposed along the High Street from the junction with Gallows Hill Lane and Bedmond Road to beyond Brakespeare School, Gallow Hill Lane. To allow Herts Highways time to respond to the Clerk's letter requesting vehicle measuring strips at both ends of the High Street, it was agreed to put progressing the proposal of a 20 mph zone on the agenda for the next meeting.

The appeal following refusal of planning permission, reference 08/1384/ful, for (part retrospective) erection of a timber outbuilding to be used for agricultural purposes at 152 Toms Lane, Kings Langley, was noted. As the description was amended after the Parish Council had commented, it was agreed to write to the Planning Inspectorate to confirm comments.
