



Information About Our Use of Cookies

Our website uses cookies to distinguish you from other users of our website. This helps us to provide you with a positive experience when you browse our website and also allows us to improve our site.

By continuing to browse the site, you are agreeing to our use of cookies.

Cookies contain information that is transferred to your computer's hard drive. A cookie is a small file of letters and numbers that we store in your browser or on the hard drive of your computer, if you agree.

We use the following cookies:

- **Strictly necessary cookies.** These are cookies that are required for the operation of our website.
- **Analytical/performance cookies.** They allow us to recognise and count the number of visitors and to see how visitors move around our website. This helps us to improve the way our website works, for example, by ensuring that users are finding what they are looking for easily.
- **Functionality cookies.** We do not currently use functional cookies.
- **Targeting cookies.** We do not use targeting cookies; our site does not deploy advertising nor do we provide information to advertisers for use elsewhere.

You can find more information about the individual cookies we use and the purposes for which we use them in the table below:

Necessary, analytical and performance cookies	abbotslangley-pc.gov.uk	These cookie enables us to: a. Estimate our audience size, pages most viewed and usage patterns. b. Speed up your searches. c. Recognise you when you return to our site, so we do not show the "first visit" cookie message.	We measure website traffic by pages viewed, repeat views and peak volumes. This enables us to ensure that the servers that deliver our web pages are well "balanced" and can cope with peak demands.

You can block cookies by activating the setting on your browser that allows you to refuse the setting of all or some cookies.

However, if you use your browser settings to block all cookies (including essential cookies) you may not be able to access all or parts of our site.

All essential and tracking cookies on our website will expire after 24 months.
